His selfless dedication earned him numerous accolades, including the JBPCO Chairman's Award, Northwood University Leadership Award, LTAA Chairman's Award, SBN Athena Award, PRO Jim Borré Lifetime Achievement Award, SEMA Hall of Fame induction, SEMA Person of the Year recognition, Heart Gallery Dedicated Service Award, and most recently, induction into the TORA Hall of Fame.

Upon announcing his retirement, Ayres remarked, "I was honored to have been chosen as the first Executive Director of AACF. I was blessed with a fantastic Board of Trustees to work with these past 9 plus years." He added, "I am proud of the work we were able to accomplish, and I love the mission of the Foundation. Outside of the

limelight, we help many individuals and families through kindness and support. I will be forever grateful for the opportunity to serve and help my brothers and sisters in the Automotive Aftermarket."

Current AACF President Jon Owens added, "The Foundation is in a great place, as solid and as capable of helping as we've ever been in our 65 years of service. Joel played a major role in lifting us to this place and on behalf of our Board, we wish him nothing but joy, relaxation and time to spend with his loving family in his retirement years."
